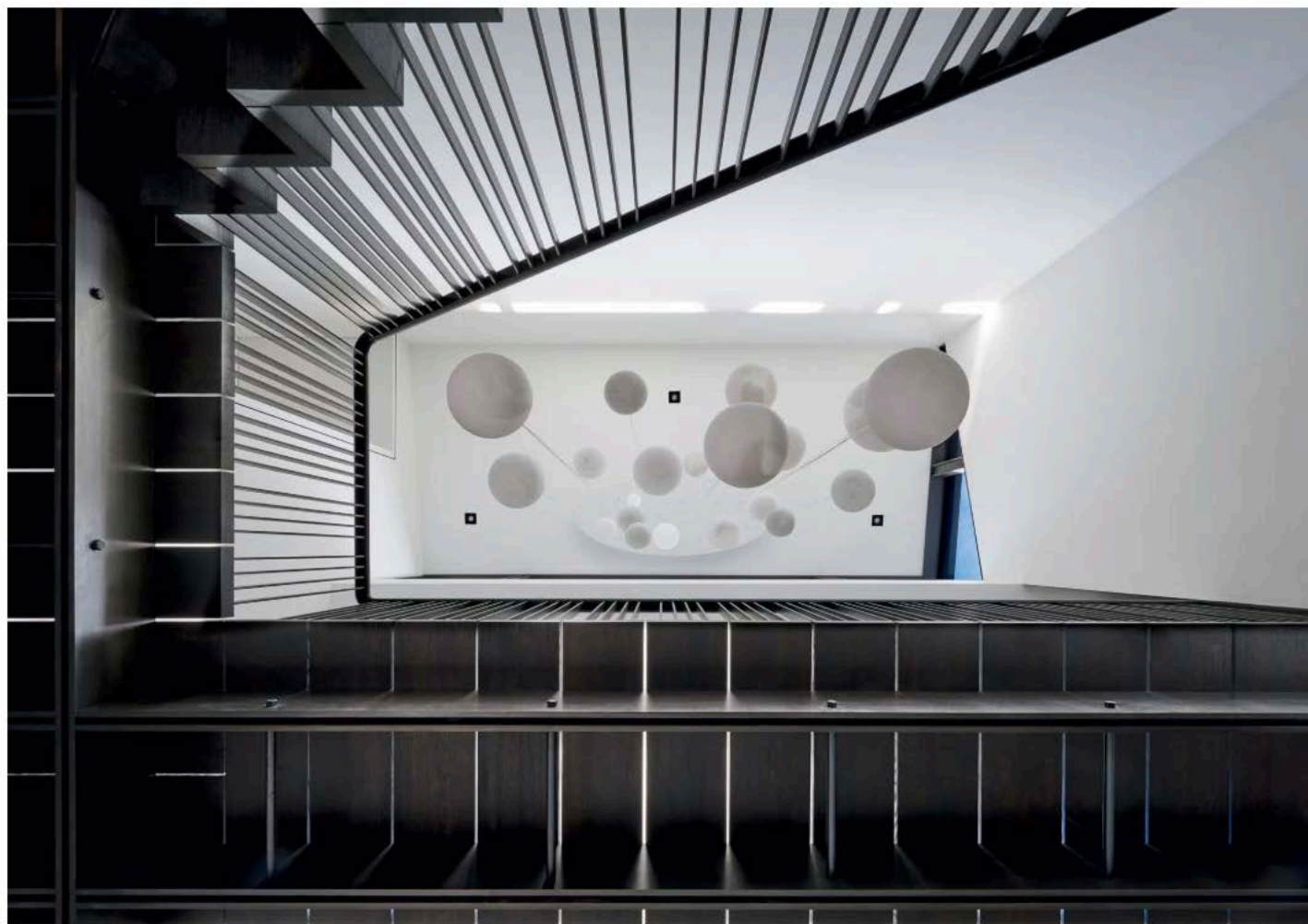


Washington's Top 9 New Houses of the Year

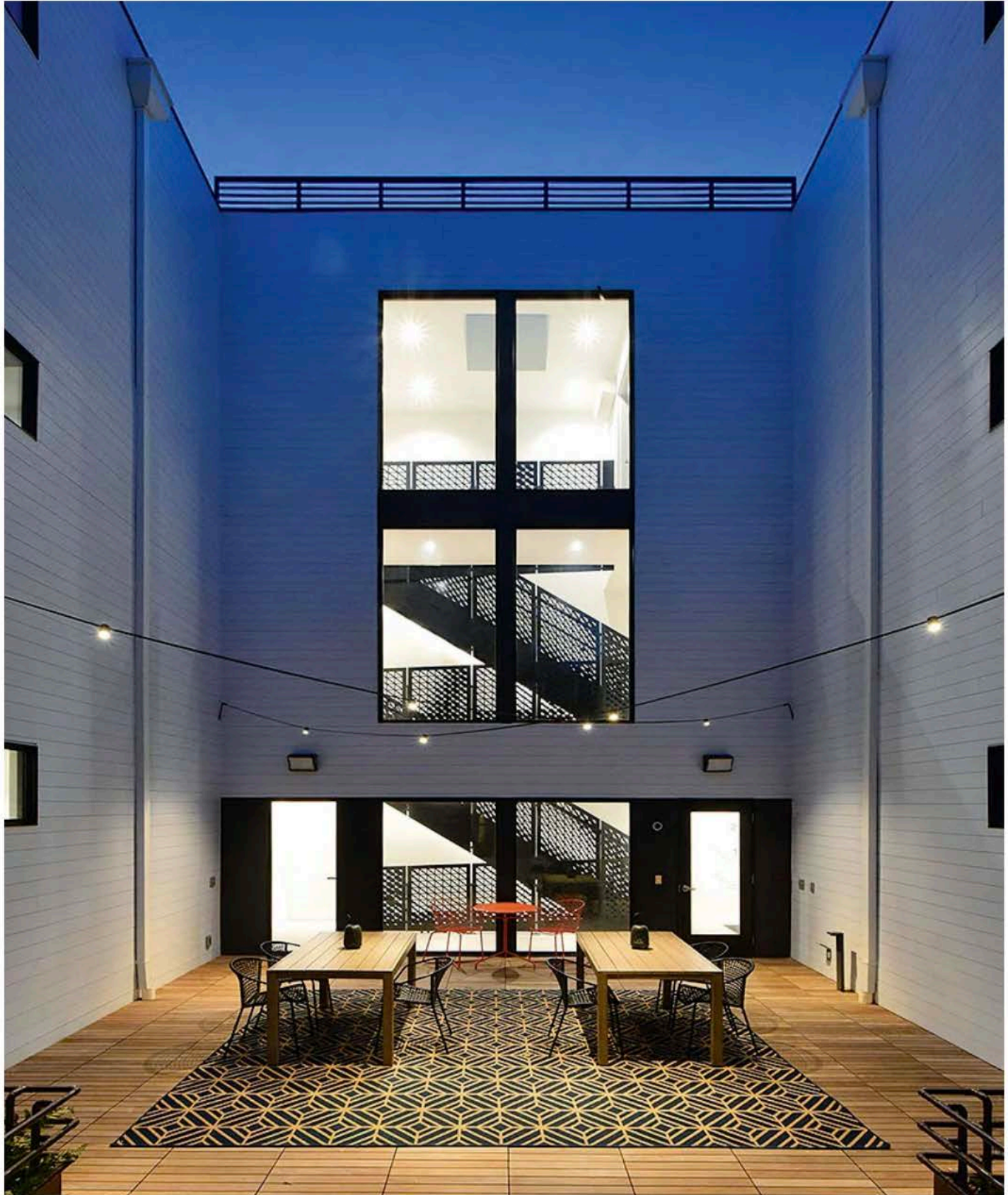
